# Youth Opportunities Scholarship Application 2024 – Semester 1



#### **General Information:** Please detach and keep this page for your own records.

The Youth Opportunities Scholarship program is open to graduates of the Youth Opportunities program for two years after completing the program. Scholarships are aimed at helping students reach their potential, through assistance towards goals and future career plans. Scholarships are generally awarded between the value of \$1,000 to \$1,500.

Students who have shown continued effort and progress towards their goals, who show Personal Leadership, and those who face hardship will be prioritised.

Graduates can apply for a scholarship in **one or more** of the following categories:

- 1. Academic tutoring
- 2. Career guidance
- 3. Financial support

<u>Please note:</u> if applying for more than one of the categories above, please rank from 1 to 3 in order of importance, as we are unable to be able to award in multiple categories. If awarded a scholarship, item(s) applied for need to be claimed within **two years** of being awarded the scholarship.

Students who wish to apply must approach a teacher at their school to act as a referee, supporting the student's application. There is a one-page section for the referee to complete once the student and parent/guardian sections are complete.

Scholarship applications for Semester 1 2024 are due by Friday the 3<sup>rd</sup> of May at 5:00pm. Please note that any applications that are late or incomplete will not be considered or reviewed. # **FAQ** Frequently Asked Questions



## 1. What does financial need mean? What is proof of financial need?

Our scholarships are aimed at students who are facing financial or other types of hardship, allowing them opportunities they wouldn't otherwise be able to access. To be considered eligible to apply you **must** receive one of the following:

If you are in receipt of any of these benefits, your family's financial situation has already been assessed by the government. You will need to provide proof, such as a copy of the card, or a letter from Centrelink showing payment of benefits.

**Please note:** Family Tax Benefit, expired cards or a Medicare card will not be considered as proof of financial need.

#### 2. Why do you need my latest school report?

We want to ensure we reward applicants who are demonstrating **personal leadership** with their schoolwork. This does not mean you need to be a straight A student; we encourage anyone to apply.

## 3. What kind of supporting documents should I attach?

Anything that supports your application and shows motivation, skill development, achievement, community service and determination to achieve your goals. This may include (but is not limited to) certificates, awards, newspaper articles, written references and copies of work. We want to see how you're being a personal leader!

#### 4. What can I apply for?

- <u>Academic Tutoring</u> provided by an external tutoring company and is aimed at helping students improve their grades and get academic support towards their education and career goals.
- <u>Career Guidance</u> opportunity to be linked with someone in the industry you are interested in, with the possibility of short-term guidance, advice or work experience.
- <u>Financial Support</u> purchasing an item or opportunity that wouldn't otherwise be available to a student. For example: laptop, textbooks, TAFE or VET fees, courses, transport costs, equipment, driving lessons

Please note: All items applied for need to align with your educational goals or career aspirations.

You cannot apply for things like cash, cost of living support, school fees, school uniforms, vehicles, vehicle maintenance or vehicle running costs, HELP debt support or university fees (for university and bespoke scholarships only), or anything you are not linking to your goals.

#### 5. What if my requested opportunity/item isn't available?

In the instance that what you have requested is not available or possible (e.g. there is no tutor in the subject you have requested) we will work with you to find an alternative opportunity that still supports you towards your academic and career goals.

#### 6. When will I be informed if I have been successful in my application?

All applicants (successful and unsuccessful) will be informed by **Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> of June 2024 via text message**. Please ensure your phone number is correct on this form to ensure you receive this information. If your phone number changes, please notify us as soon as possible.



#### 7. If I am successful, when will I receive my Scholarship?

We will arrange delivery to your school for your item to be picked up (we send out vouchers with instructions for things like career guidance and other experiential items like driving lessons and tutoring). All successful applicants will be encouraged to celebrate their Youth Opportunities scholarship with your school community at a school assembly, as a celebration of your achievements.

## 8. Can I re-apply?

All applicants are encouraged to re-apply, Scholarship applications are open in Semester 1 and Semester 2 each year. Previous recipients are eligible to apply for every round for two years after year 10.
